

## Gary Tricker Summer School Scholarship

### Calling all printmakers!

Print Council Aotearoa New Zealand is inviting nominations/applications for the Gary Tricker Summer School Scholarship for an emerging printmaker to attend Summer School in January 2024 in Wellington.

The Gary Tricker Summer School Scholarship is a new fund kindly donated by the Gary Tricker deceased estate from the sale of his studio items.

The award is for **\$800** and includes attendance at 4 days of the PCANZ Summer School workshops 2024 in Wellington (valued at \$396), membership of PCANZ for 2024 (valued at \$50) and an additional cash amount of \$354 which is intended to go towards materials, accommodation and travel to the summer school.

**Deadline for submissions: 1<sup>st</sup> November 2023**

**Summer School Workshop Dates: Monday 8th January to Friday 12th January 2024**

**Venue: Queen Margaret College in Wellington**

**The scholarship is to attend either the 4-day workshop or two 2-day workshops.**

**Applicants will be notified by Friday 17<sup>th</sup> November 2024**

Criteria:

We are interested in printmakers who would develop printmaking skills of their own in order to:

- inspire others, spread the knowledge of printmaking throughout the community and empower others to explore printmaking
- and who are unable to raise the funds to attend the summer school already.

You will need to supply:

1. Full name
2. Contact information (phone, email, address)
3. How the printmaker's attendance at the summer school will support printmaking
4. How the scholarship would help the printmaker attend PCANZ Summer School 2024

The scholarship recipient will be asked to write a brief report on the benefit and value of their experience, 6 months after their attendance at Summer School.
